Dear fellow readers of The Urantia Book and friends of the Global Endeavor,

On Saturday, December 8, we conducted our third webinar based on topic 8 of *Revelation Revealed*, a topic that is entitled, "Comparing and contrasting the true teachings of Jesus with the traditional tenets and practices of organized, institutional Christianity."

We began in the middle of page 91 of the document, starting with the heading "(b) Sacrifice and atonement." Therefore participants read and commented on the teachings about sacrifice and atonement that the Apostle Paul invented, as described and analyzed by the Midwayer Commission [1670:4 / 149:2.3] and by a Divine Counselor [60:3,5-6 / 4:5.3,4-6]. These teachings have profound implications, creating the net religious and philosophic context whereby the cross (or the crucifix) became the key symbol that stands for the Christian faith.

In part, participants deplored the concept of an angry God, thereby agreeing with the Divine Counselor that "It is an affront to God to believe, hold, or teach that innocent blood must be shed in order to win his favor or to divert the fictitious divine wrath." Participants emphasized that God is a loving Father, not an angry one, then commented on the psychological and emotional implications that are closely associated with human fathers on earth. Several participants offered the view that a positive relationship with one's own father on Urantia facilitates and/or reinforces the conviction of a Universal Father who loves and encourages us.

I then probed the impact of traditional Christian teachings by asking participants to begin appraising ten statements about salvation (survival into the afterlife) that I had circulated to them beforehand. (See the list of statements shown at the end of this message.)

Statements along these general lines have often been associated with traditional Christianity, although no single denomination proclaims or promotes all ten of them. Therefore it is best to understand them as examples. The time available on December 8 permitted participants to exchange detailed comments on the first three, but we did not reach statements 4 through 10. Therefore we will discuss and appraise them during our webinar on December 15.

After that, participants will grapple with formal question 61 appearing on page 92 of *Revelation Revealed*:

61. When the Divine Counselor declares that "the inhabitants of Urantia are to find deliverance from these ancient errors" [a Divine Counselor, 60.6 / 4.5.6], is he essentially predicting that most human

beings will eventually accept the teachings of *The Urantia Book*? Are you willing to predict that any institutional religion whose leaders proclaim Jesus as the Son of God will abandon its core doctrine that he died on the cross to redeem mankind and atone for our sins?

In all likelihood, there will be sufficient time left for participants to begin discussing teachings and practices that amount to discriminating against women, either explicitly or by implication. (Reference: pages 93 to 95 of *Revelation Revealed*.)

- 1. God saves whom he wills. Although it is possible to be optimistic about someone who leads a godly life, in the final analysis we do not and cannot know whether God has chosen a particular person for heaven, or for hell.
- 2. It is necessary to believe in Jesus in order to be saved (in order to survive into the afterlife).
- 3. Everyone who believes in Jesus will be saved (will survive into the afterlife).
- 4. Everyone who believes in Jesus will be saved (will survive into the afterlife), but only if he or she has been properly baptized.
- 5. Everyone who believes in Jesus will be saved (will survive into the afterlife), but only if he or she has been properly baptized and has accepted the doctrines and teachings that the church proclaims.
